ORDER

On March 23, 2023, the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by its Chair Nicole A. Cofer, in accordance with Rule 3.10 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, filed its written recommended disposition in this matter, recommending that:

- (1) Respondent's law license be suspended for thirty (30) days with automatic reinstatement pursuant to Rule 3.31 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure; and
- (2) Respondent be ordered to pay the costs of these proceedings pursuant to Rule 3.15 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure.

On April 3, 2023, the respondent, Andrew Courtenay Craig, self-represented, filed his consent to the recommendation along with a "Motion for Imposition." The Office of Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, by Kristin P. Halkias, Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, filed its consent to the recommendation on April 5, 2023.

Upon consideration and review on April 20, 2023, the Court is of the opinion to and does concur with and approve the recommended disposition of the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board. The "Motion for Imposition" is refused. It is ORDERED that:

(1) The license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent Andrew Courtenay Craig is suspended for thirty days, effective immediately, with automatic reinstatement under Rule 3.31 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure; and

(2) Respondent shall pay the costs of these proceedings in accordance with Rule 3.15 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure.

Service of a copy of this order upon the respondent Andrew Courtenay Craig, the Office of Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, and the West Virginia State Bar, constitutes sufficient notice of the contents.
