On a former day, to-wit, November 30, 2011, came the respondent, David Barnabei, *pro se*, and presented to the Court his motion for reinstatement of his license to practice law in the State of West Virginia. Respondent's license to practice law was suspended by order of this Court on December 28, 2009.

Thereafter, on January 27, 2012, came the petitioner, Office of Disciplinary Counsel, by Rachael L. Fletcher Cipoletti, Chief Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, and presented to the Court its written response thereto.

Upon review and consideration whereof, the Court is satisfied that respondent has complied with this Court's September 25, 2008 order. The Court is therefore of opinion to and doth hereby grant said motion for reinstatement, subject to the following conditions:

(1) respondent shall follow the recommended treatment plan of his psychologist and provide written reports of his compliance, including the medical reports from the psychologist, to the Office of Disciplinary Counsel on a quarterly basis for the next twelve months; and (2) respondent's practice of law shall be supervised by Robert G. McCoid,

Esq., who respondent shall meet with at least monthly and the supervising attorney shall file monthly reports to the Office of Disciplinary Counsel.
