At a Regular Term of the Supreme Court of Appeals continued and held at Charleston, Kanawha County, on the 26th day of March, 1991, the following order was made and entered:

On a former day, to-wit, March 20, 1991, came the complainant, the Committee on Legal Ethics of The West Virginia State Bar, by Sherri D. Goodman, its attorney, and presented to the Court the Hearing Panel Subcommittee's recommendation and the Full Hearing Panel's adoption thereof that the respondent, James H. Hearst, be reinstated to the practice of law in the State of West Virginia subject to the payment of necessary dues and compliance with Mandatory Continuing Legal Education requirements.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby adopt the Committee on Legal Ethics of The West Virginia State Bar's recommendation that the respondent be reinstated to the practice of law in the State of West Virginia upon the payment of necessary dues and upon compliance with Mandatory Continuing Legal Education requirements.

It is therefore Adjudged and Ordered that the license and authority of the respondent, James H. Hearst, to

practice law in the State of West Virginia, be, and the same hereby is, reinstated, subject to the payment of dues and compliance with Mandatory Continuing Legal Education requirements.
