On a former day to-wit, February 16, 2007, came the Office of Disciplinary
Counsel, by Lawrence J. Lewis, Chief Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, its attorney, pursuant
to Rule 3.23 of the West Virginia Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presents
to the Court its petition seeking the immediate administrative suspension of the license to
practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, Todd A. Twyman, a member
of The West Virginia State Bar, as provided therein, including that the respondent be
examined by a qualified medical expert designated by the Office of Disciplinary Counsel
and that all disciplinary matters against him be held in abeyance, and pursuant to Rule 3.2
of the West Virginia Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, requesting that this Court
authorize the Chief Judge of Kanawha County to appoint an attorney to serve as trustee to
protect the interest of respondent's clients.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby grant said
petition. It is therefore ordered that the Respondent's license to practice law in the State
of West Virginia be, and it hereby is, suspended administratively and the Respondent
ordered to be examined by a qualified medical expert designated by the Office of

Disciplinary Counsel pursuant to Rule 3.23 of the West Virginia Rules of Law.
Disciplinary Procedure. It is further ordered that all disciplinary matters against the
Respondent be held in abeyance until further order of this Court.

It is further ordered that the Honorable Charles E. King, Jr., Chief Judge of the
Circuit Court of Kanawha County be, and he hereby is, authorized to appoint Katherine
L. Dooley, Esq. to serve as trustee to protect the interests of Respondent's clients.

Service of a copy of this order upon the respondent and upon the Honorable Charles
E. King, Jr., Chief Judge of the Ninth Judicial Circuit, shall constitute sufficient notice
of the contents herein.
