Lewis, Chief Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, its attorney, pursuant to Rule 3.23 of the West Virginia Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presents to the Court its petition seeking the immediate administrative suspension of the license I practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, Todd A.
