On a former day, to-wit, April 25, 2007, came the petitioner, A. Wayne King, a suspended member of The West Virginia State Bar, pursuant to Rules 3.31 and 3.32 of the Rules of Lawyer Diciplinary Procedure, and presented to the Court his petition for the reinstatement of his license to practice law in the State of West Virginia.

Thereafter, on the same day, came the Office of Disciplinary Counsel, by

Lawrence J. Lewis, Chief Disciplinary Counsel, and presented to the Court its written
response thereto, stating that it has no objections to the reinstatement of the petitioner.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby grant said petition. It is therefore ordered that the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of A. Wayne King, be, and it hereby is, reinstated.

It is further ordered, that pursuant to this Court's opinion filed on February 16, 2007, the petitioner undergo a one-year period of supervised practice following his reinstatement, with said supervisor agreed upon by the petitioner and the Office of Disciplinary Counsel.
