On a former day, to-wit, March 28, 2007, came the petitioner, Michael F. Niggemyer, who is held in contempt of this Court for his failure to comply with certain orders of this Court, and therefore suspended from The West Virginia State Bar, and presented to the Court his petition for the reinstatement of his license to practice law in the State of West Virginia.

Thereafter, on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2007, came the Office of Disciplinary Counsel, by Rachael L. Fletcher Cipoletti, its attorney, and presented to the Court its written response thereto.

Finally, on the 8th day of May, 2007, came the petitioner, and presented to the Court his reply to the response.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby refuse said petition for reinstatement. Petitioner may subsequently file a petition for reinstatement once the Office of Disciplinary Counsel determines that all terms and conditions of reinstatement have been satisfied through Petitioner's compliance with this Court's prior orders and directives therein, including satisfaction of the specific issues raised by the

Office of Disciplinary Counsel regarding his accounting practices and the deposits at issue.
