On a former day, to-wit, April 11, 2007, came the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by Charlene A. Vaughan, its chairperson, pursuant to Rule 3.20 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure regarding reciprocal discipline, and presented to the Court its written recommended disposition in this matter recommending that the same discipline imposed by the Court of Appeals of Maryland be imposed by this Court and that the respondent's license to practice law in the State of West Virginia be indefinitely suspended.

Thereafter, on the 3rd day of May, 2007, came the respondent, Candace K. Calhoun, pro se, and presented to the Court her written objections thereto.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby adopt the written recommended disposition of the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board. It is therefore ordered that the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of Candace K. Calhoun, be, and it hereby is, indefinitely suspended. It is further ordered that the respondent may file a petition for reinstatement with this Court once she has been reinstated by the Court of Appeals of Maryland.
