The Court, having maturely considered the record, the written recommended disposition filed by the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, and the brief of counsel thereon, doth hereby annul the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, Thomas H, McCorkle, for violating Rules 1.15.(a); 1.7(b); 1.8(a); 3.4(b); 8.1(a) and 8.4(c) and (d) of the Rules of Professional Conduct; all of which is ordered to be certified to the parties herein. In order to reinstate his license to practice law in the State of West Virginia, the respondent shall petition for reinstatement pursuant to Rule 3.32 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure. Conditions for reinstatement are, the respondent: (1) shall be certified by an independent health care professional in the appropriate field that he is in such condition that his ability to practice law will result in the protection of the public and (2) that he reimburse the Lawyer Disciplinary Board for the cost of these proceedings, in the amount of \$ 4,385.68.

The syllabus of points adjudicated, prefixed to the written opinion aforesaid, prepared Per Curiam, was concurred in by Chief Justice Davis and Justices Starcher, Maynard, Albright and Benjamin.


