

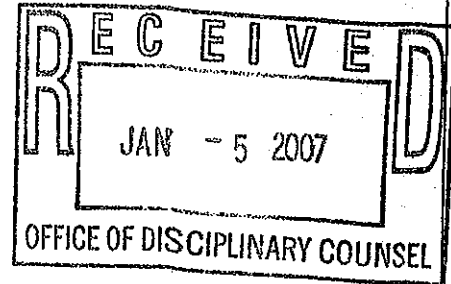

The Court, having maturely considered the record, the written recommendation filed by the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, and the oral argument and briefs of counsel thereon, doth hereby adopt said recommendation. The respondent's license to practice law is hereby reinstated with the following conditions: 1) eighteen months of supervised practice, the supervisor is to be nominated by the respondent and approved by the Office of Disciplinary Counsel; 2) respondent must inform the supervisor of all criminal cases accepted for the period of supervised practice; 3) during the supervised practice period respondent must not accept any cases in which a member of the Huntington Police Department is involved; 4) undergo weekly comprehensive psychological counseling with a licensed mental health professional for a six-month period and must provide a report to the Office of Disciplinary Counsel at the end of the six-month period; and 5) reimburse the Lawyer Disciplinary Board in the amount of \$ 800.31, for the costs of these proceedings; all of which is ordered to be certified to the parties herein.

The syllabus of points adjudicated, prefixed to the written opinion aforesaid, prepared Per Curiam, was concurred in by Chief Justice Davis and Justices Starcher, Maynard, Albright and Benjamin.
