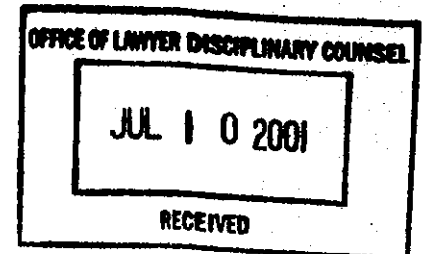


This day came the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by Nancy Hill, its chairperson, pursuant to Rule 3.33(c) of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, and presented to the Court its *Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommendation* in regard to the petition for reinstatement filed on the 14th day of December, 1999, by the petitioner, Emmanuel B. Loucas, recommending that petitioner's license to practice law in the State of West Virginia be reinstated subject to such terms and conditions as the Court may direct.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of opinion to and doth hereby adopt the aforesaid recommendation. It is therefore ordered that the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the petitioner, Emmanuel B. Loucas, be, and it hereby is, reinstated effective this date. It is further ordered that the petitioner be restored as a member in good standing of The West Virginia State Bar, subject to satisfaction of requirements as to payment of The West Virginia State Bar membership fees and mandatory continuing legal education. Justice Davis would refuse.
