

The Court, having maturely considered the recommendations of the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, the briefs of counsel and oral argument thereon, doth hereby impose the following sanctions upon the respondent, David M. Ansell, a member of The West Virginia State Bar, for violating Rules 8.4(c) and 8.4(d) of the Rules of Professional Conduct: (1) respondent's license to practice law in the State of West Virginia is hereby suspended for a period of sixty days, effective the 19th day of November, 2001; (2) respondent shall complete twelve hours of continuing legal education classes in ethics within the next reporting period; and (3) respondent shall reimburse the Lawyer Disciplinary Board for the costs incurred in the investigation of this proceeding in the amount of Five Hundred Eighteen Dollars and Fifty-Three Cents (\$518.53), said reimbursement to be completed within one year from the date of this *Mandate*.

The syllabus of points adjudicated, prefixed to the written opinion aforesaid, prepared Per Curiam, was concurred in by Chief Justice McGraw and Justices Davis, Starcher, Maynard and Albright.
