On July 1, 2019, the petitioner, Douglas C. Meister, filed a petition seeking to voluntarily resign as a member of the West Virginia State Bar and to have his name stricken from the rolls thereof, pursuant to Rule 3.26(a) of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure. Thereafter, on September 30, 2019, the Investigative Panel of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by its Chair Amy Crossan, pursuant to Rule 3.26(c) of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, filed its written recommendation.
