## Suspension Order

On February 4, 2016, the Office of Disciplinary Counsel, by Rachael L. Fletcher Cipoletti, Chief Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, presented to the Court a petition, pursuant to Rule 3.27 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, seeking the immediate suspension of the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, Jason R. Grubb, a member of The West Virginia State Bar.

Counsel for the respondent was served with the petition on February 19, 2016. No request for a hearing pursuant to Rule 3.27(c) was received.

Upon consideration, the Court is of the opinion that good cause exists to find that the respondent has committed a violation of the Rules of Professional Conduct and poses a substantial threat of irreparable harm to the public, pursuant to Rule 3.27(c). It is therefore ordered that the license to practice law in the State of West Virginia of the respondent, Jason R. Grubb, shall be, and it hereby is, **suspended**.
