ORDER

On July 21, 2015, the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board, by James R. Akers, its chairperson, pursuant to Rule 3.20 of the Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure, presented to the Court its written recommended disposition in this reciprocal disciplinary action, recommending that the same sanction that the State of Maryland issued be imposed. Thus, the Hearing Panel Subcommittee recommends that the respondent's license to practice law in the State of West Virginia be suspended, indefinitely, with the right to apply for reinstatement after six months.

Upon consideration whereof, the Court is of the opinion to and does hereby concur with and does approve the recommended disposition of the Hearing Panel Subcommittee of the Lawyer Disciplinary Board. It is therefore ordered that the same sanction imposed by the State of Maryland will be imposed here, hereto: (1) the respondent's license to practice law in the State

of West Virginia is hereby suspended, indefinitely; (2) the respondent may petition for reinstatement pursuant to Rule 3.32, Rules of Lawyer Disciplinary Procedure any time after six months from the date of this order.
